As vice president and general manager of the Advisory Services Division (TASC), Mr. Parker leads a team of over 4700 employees responsible for providing mission-focused advanced systems engineering and technical assistance services as well as other analysis and advisory services across the defense, intelligence, federal, state and local markets.

Previously, Mr. Parker was president of the Northrop Grumman Information Technology (IT) sector's Intelligence group, which led the development, customization and deployment of intelligence-related technologies, systems and services to the U.S. government. The Intelligence group maintained numerous engineering and research laboratories and managed a robust independent research and development program to establish and deliver mission-critical technologies and capabilities.

Also at Northrop Grumman, Mr. Parker was president of the IT sector's Federal Enterprise Solutions unit, which served the civil sector of the federal government market. The unit's offerings included enterprise-wide network solutions, IT systems development, integration, services and program management.

Prior to joining Northrop Grumman in 2000, Mr. Parker was the managing partner of the PricewaterhouseCoopers L.L.P., Washington Consulting Practice in Washington, D.C. He was responsible for the professional services provided to the federal government, state and local governments, the health care sector and the postal sector. He also built a consulting practice to serve commercial companies that deal with the public sector. Earlier, Mr. Parker was project partner/director for change management, business process reengineering, IT-enabled transformation, e-business transformation and other initiatives for numerous private and public sector clients.

Mr. Parker retired from the U.S. Navy after 20 years of service. Among his many assignments he commanded a Navy destroyer during the first Persian Gulf War, he served as the AA to the Secretary of the Navy, and he was a participant in the White House Fellows Program.

Mr. Parker has written extensively about change management, leadership and transformation initiatives to achieve improved business results. He has a master's degree in International Relations from Miami University (Ohio) and a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Auburn University. Mr. Parker has served as a commissioner on the President's Commission on White House Fellowships, president of the White House Fellows Association, a member of the Planning Forum and a principal on the Council for Excellence in Government.
